DEFINITION OF CLASSES

Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the show are not eligible for exhibition

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' Classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must, at the time of entry, be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. **Friday 12th March 2010**

Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes, but when entering for Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety Classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a special prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

- 1 **Withdrawal:** the dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 9(j) and 20.
- 2 **Transfer:**
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height, or in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of their being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height..
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If any exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

Minor Puppy: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the show

Puppy: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show

Junior: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the show

Yearling For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the show

Maiden For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First prize at an Open or Championship Show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy Classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

Novice: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy Classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

Graduate For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not

Post Graduate: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not

Limit: For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed

Open: For all dogs of the breed s for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.

Veteran For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the show

Brace For Two Exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team

Special Field Trial The exhibit to have won an award at a Field Trial. (N.B. does NOT include Show Gundog Working Certificate)

Special Working The exhibit to have been placed 1st -4th or to have obtained a Certificate of Merit In a test of work, Working Trial or Obedience Test (certificate of Merit for Puppy Stakes excepted) or graded at a Spring Pointing Test, or having been awarded a place rosette at an Open Agility Test

Beginners For owner, handler or exhibit not having won a first a Championship Show
Special Open - (Long Haired) Confined to Long Haired Weimaraners

Special Breeders For dogs bred and handled by the exhibitor

RULES and REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 9.00 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required
3. Judging will commence at 10.00 a.m.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed, by which time all dogs must be removed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the show management
6. **Entry fees : Members** £4.00 first entry per dog; **Non-Members** £5.00 first entry per dog; £1.00 each subsequent entry with same dog **Not for Competition** £1.00 per dog. **Catalogues** £2.00 prepaid with entries (£2.50 on the day) **Trade stands** £15.00
7. **Prize Money.** Is not on offer at this show
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries..
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition (i.e. puppies born after 18th October 2008)
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden
11. **Best Puppy in Show** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled, the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of the Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and are unbeaten by any other puppy.
Withdrawal from Competition Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate, in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition
Proviso For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
12. **Best in Show** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
Withdrawal from Competition Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition

Proviso For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs

13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with permission of the Show Management
14. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
15. All exhibitors must be familiar with the Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition)
16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor
17. **DOGS IN CARS**
Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

18. Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered
19. All dogs must be accompanied and have a strong collar and lead
20. **Safety of Dogs** The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of all dogs entered and for property entrusted to it but it must be distinctly understood by exhibitors and purchasers and all other persons that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss or detention of or damage to a dog or dogs, boxes, hampers, collars or other property, whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever or from any act or omission or themselves, their officers, servants, agents or others and it is on this understanding only that entries will be received.
21. Should any Judge being prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement, the Committee reserve the right to appoint another Judge to fulfil their duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be returned.
22. Entry fees will be refunded to exhibitors who produce a certificate of a dog's illness signed by a Veterinary Surgeon within 24 hours of the close of show. This will not apply in the case of a bitch coming into season

23. Conversation is not allowed in the judging ring. Exhibitors showing dogs are not permitted to hold conversation with the Judge during the competition and any exhibitors who persist in addressing the judge after being requested not to do so by the Ring Steward, the Judge or any of the Committee will be reported to the Kennel Club. No persons other than the exhibitors (officials excepted) will be allowed in the ring during the judging of classes or specials.
24. **EXHIBITS ONLY ALLOWED** No animal other than a dog duly entered for the Show will be allowed within the precincts of the Show during its continuance except by special permission of the Committee
25. All rules and regulations or definitions or instructions of the nature of rules and regulations printed for convenience in other parts of this Schedule shall be deemed to be regulations of the Show Committee and shall have the same effect as if they formed part of these regulations.
26. Every exhibitor making an entry shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations and it is on this understanding only that entries are received. Vicious dogs are not eligible and must not be sent to the show. Exhibitors are held responsible for any damage done by their dogs during the exhibition.
27. The Schedule for the show is deemed to be contract between the Show Authorities and the Exhibitors and neither party is permitted to make alterations or modifications except as provided by K.C. Regulations.
28. Exhibitors passes in the form of Ring Numbers will be issued on entry to the Show. Exhibitors requiring acknowledgment of entries must send a stamped self-addressed postcard with their entries.
29. Any owner, Competitor, Handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any litter, loose hair or fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the Licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches
30. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club Licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches
31. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency, b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees
32. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

IMPORTANT NOTICES

In accordance with Kennel Club regulations,
NO PUPPIES UNDER 6 MONTHS OF AGE
Are allowed in the showground, this also includes the car park.

This does not apply to puppies of 4-6 months entered Not for Competition at this show - please provide all details on the entry form

DAMAGE CAUSED BY CHILDREN

The Committee wish to make it clear that children attending the show are the sole responsibility of their parent and must be kept under control at all times,

The Weimaraner Club of G.B. will not accept responsibility for injury, damage etc. , however caused

DOG FOULING

It is the EXHIBITOR'S RESPONSIBILITY to clean up after their dogs and deposit in the bins or bags supplied at the venue. A strict patrol will be made. It has been noted from the last two shows that exhibitors are cleaning up after their dogs but some are leaving the bags beside their vehicles as it is too much effort to place in the bins or bags. We cannot afford to lose venues. Apart from the point made, it is the law to clean up after our dogs.

IMPORTANT EXTRACT FROM KENNEL CLUB SHOW REGULATIONS

Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition F (Annex B)

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these show regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these regulation will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42
2.
 - a) No substance, which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat, may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance, which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog, may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition
3. No act or operation which alters the natural confirmation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee
 - b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed
 - c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered would be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. Any individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

Dogs in Cars on Hot Days

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm.

Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.
